

REOPEN GEORGIA FOR BUSINESS MINIMUM BASIC OPERATIONS

Effective April 24, 2020 by executive order of Governor Brian Kemp



Keep a safe workplace

Screen and evaluate workers who show symptoms; don't go to work sick; employers must send workers that are showing symptoms home; employers should provide disinfectant and sanitation products for workers to clean their workspace, equipment, and tools



Keep a clean workplace

Enhance sanitation; require handwashing stations; provide personal protective equipment as available and appropriate for operations



Create safe business practices

Meetings should be conducted virtually and employees should not gather together in the work area; implement teleworking and staggered shifts for all possible workers



Increase physical space

Between workers and customers and between workers' worksites



Prohibit handshaking & encourage hand hygiene

Place notices at the entrance to the workplace & in other workplace areas where they are likely to be seen



Enforce social distancing

of non-cohabitating persons while present on such entity's leased or owned property. Additionally, permit workers to take breaks outside, in their office/personal workspace, or in other areas where social distancing is attainable



Suspend the use of PIN pads

PIN entry devices, electronic signature capture, and other credit card receipt signature requirements to the extent such suspension is permitted by agreements with credit companies/agencies



Provide alternate point of sale

outside of buildings, including curbside pick-up or delivery of products/services if an alternative point of sale is permitted under GA law; deliver intangible services remotely whenever possible



Avoid shared use

Discourage workers from using other workers' phones, desks, offices, or other work tools/equipment

This Executive Order applies to the following businesses: gyms, bowling alleys, tattoo parlors, hair salons, barbershops, nail salons, and massage therapists.
